

Gov Uba Sani: The Champion of inclusivity

eople from all walks of life gathered at the Umaru Musa Yarádua Conference Centre for the Women Economic Empowerment Summit on November 22, 2024, to witness the three-in-one event. Senator Uba

Sani, the Kaduna State Governor, used the opportunity to highlight his achievements in Agriculture, poverty alleviation and women empowerment. At intervals, delegates and distinguished personalities interrupted his speech with applause and chants of "Balaraben Gwamna", "Uba Uban Kowa'' and other slogans of praises, underscoring his administration's milestones.

Firstly, Governor Uba Sani

free to 120,000 smallholder farmers."

unveiled his footprints in the Agricultural sector, an area where Kaduna State enjoys comparative advantage as the number one subnational in maize and ginger cultivation. Recently, the State made history by carrying out the largest free fertilizer distribution in Nigeria and women farmers were key beneficiaries of the exercise, he disclosed. The Governor has approved the "distribution of 500 trucks of fertilizer, out of which 240,000 bags has been distributed

Besides, Kaduna State has "distributed vital inputs—high-quality seeds, fertilizers, agrochemicals, and farming equipment—to 41,693 smallholder farmers and cooperatives across all 23 LGAs," the Governor told the gathering. According to him, this initiative is a gamechanger for our farmers, restoring their livelihoods and driving increased productivity across the state. In addition, the 'A Koma Gona' or Get Back to Farm Programme, has breathed new life into the agricultural sector.

Secondly, Governor Uba Sani held up his scorecard in women empowerment. "We have also recorded notable achievements in our Social Investment Programs. 65, 848 women, out of the total 70,051, benefitted from our

Conditional Cash Transfer Scheme," he disclosed at the summit. In addition, his administration has "ramped up the implementation of the Kaduna State Women Economic Empowerment Funds (KADSWEF)." According to the Governor, KADSWEF is a unique annual support initiative that provides access to financial resources for women. "We

provided the sum of N200 million in the 2024 Budget for this Fund. So far, 10,786 women have benefitted from this Fund. Government is set to flag - off the 4.0 tranche distribution to more beneficiaries with women drawn from across women cooperative groups and associations," he added. Similarly, the poverty alleviation 'A Kori Talauchi' program has empowered 4,912 underserved women across the state.

Apart from disbursing funds, Kaduna State Government has "trained over 5,000 rural/semi urban women on large scale rice shelling using modern agricultural techniques in order to increase productivity, high input processing, profit, in addition to reducing labor cost, and improving quality of products." In addition, over 120 women and Adolescent Girls have been equipped with various Vocational and Entrepreneurship Development Skills.

Not that alone, Kaduna State has been supporting women business owners, apart from funding and training. The administration has supported about 100 food vendors at the Kaduna Food Festival 2024, which took place from April 11th to 14th 2024 at Murtala Square, Kaduna.

aduna State erupted in jubilation as Governor Uba Sani announced a transformative N72,000 minimum wage, positioning the state at the forefront of worker welfare in Nigeria. This landmark policy is complemented by the governor's provision of 100 compressed natural gas (CNG) buses to offer free transportation for workers, relieving them of daily commute costs and reaffirming his administration's commitment to uplift Kaduna's workforce.

The announcement, made through a statement from the Governor's Chief Press Secretary, Malam Ibraheem Musa, highlights Governor Sani's proactive approach to addressing the socioeconomic challenges facing workers. This move is not only unprecedented but also a lifeline for civil servants, setting a new standard in the state's commitment to its workforce. For a state already gaining recognition under Sani's leadership, this development further cements Kaduna's status as a hub for progressive, people-centered governance.

Civil society leaders and workers' unions have lauded the initiative, recognizing its potential to transform lives. The N72,000 minimum wage demonstrates a clear commitment to bridging economic gaps and ensuring that the hardworking people of Kaduna can lead dignified lives. It's a decision that resonates with workers across the board, from young families looking to make ends meet to seasoned civil servants who have long awaited such a milestone.

The Free Transportation Scheme, an integral part of this welfare package, is a pioneering effort in Nigeria's public service sector. With 100 CNG buses set to roll out, the initiative promises to ease the financial burden on workers, making daily commutes efficient and cost-free. The program will be managed by a Joint Committee of labour representatives and state officials, ensuring a seamless implementation that reflects workers' needs and boosts productivity across sectors.

Governor Sani expressed his administration's unwavering commitment to "transforming the lives of the less privileged and positioning Kaduna State as a model for social welfare initiatives." This dual policy of increased wages and free transportation marks a bold shift toward a more inclusive and equitable Kaduna. Beyond its immediate economic impact, it reinforces the governor's vision of a thriving state, where no one is left behind in the

pursuit of progress.

These groundbreaking reforms have rekindled hope and optimism in Kaduna. Governor Uba Sani's leadership is setting a new bar for governance that prioritizes the wellbeing of its people, making Kaduna a beacon for progressive change in Nigeria.

In the meantime, the Kaduna State Government plans to spend N93 billion over four years for the rehabilitation of the water sector in four tranches to address the neglect the sector has suffered over the past 10 years, the Commissioner for Public Works and Infrastructure, Arc Ibrahim Hamza, has said.

He said at a press briefing, that Governor Uba Sani has also directed the payment of all outstanding salaries and wages to the staff of the Kaduna State Water Corporation (KADSWAC), amounting to N800 million.

Arc Hamza further disclosed that the staff of KADSWAC

will be put back on the state's payroll until 2027, when the corporation must have fully stabilised to run as a commercial entity.

The commissioner recalled that the governor had earlier declared a state of emergency in the water sector three months ago, which led to the appointment of Engr Kabir Rufai as the substantive Managing Director of KADSWAC.

"The corporation will collaborate with local governments to maintain generator operations. It will strengthen existing water laws to support corporate employment policy," he said.

According to him, Kaduna State is investing heavily in the rehabilitation and retrofitting of all water treatment plants and distribution mains, with an emphasis on sanitation and hygiene.

Arc Hamza pointed out that the N93 billion will be invested in four instalments, starting with N17 billion this year.

He added that N35 billion will be invested next year, N30 billion in 2026 and N11 billion will be invested in 2027.

KDSG eases land acquisition process for posterity - A news analysis

and administration involves the coordination and administration of land-related policies, laws, and regulations, as well as the management of land records, mapping, and surveying. It also includes the processes and systems used to manage and regulate the use of land and natural resources of a particular area.

In Kaduna State, the Kaduna Geographic Information Service KADGIS has the sole responsibility of handling the afore mentioned roles" these, the Service is effectively doing to ensure efficient use of land resources across the state, secure land tenure and property rights and ensure sustainable development and environmental management. Key components of the state land administration include; land registration and titling, land use planning and zoning, land valuation and taxation, surveying and mapping, land dispute resolution and conflict management and land information systems and data management.

The Kaduna Geographic Information Service provides quality and sustainable land use planning and administration in the State in line with the provisions of the Land Use Act Laws of Kaduna State and other relevant laws. It is also saddled with the responsibility of ensuring the payments of ground rents yearly by all property owners across the state, ensuring upgrading existing settlements to a certain standard that will help in urban planning, population management and help existing structures to acquire their digital Certificate of Occupancy (CFO).

With advancement in the present day Kaduna State, the Service delivers modern, efficient and reliable land administration by providing secured and affordable land titles for all through the use of Geospatial Database and Base Map.

Hence, this has enabled it to offer titles to all occupants of land parcels within urban and rural areas, rural settlements, villages, and agricultural land through the Systematic Property Registration Programme (SPRP) to help individuals from low-income community obtain titles for their property as well as the recertification of all Statutory or Customary Rights of Occupancy within Kaduna State in both urban and rural land. The service has produced a total of 80,526 C of Os under the SPRP, however, only 28,007 have been collected indicating that a good number of C of Os are still there waiting for the owners to come and collect them, while recertification has executed 13,640 C of Os.

Currently ongoing is the Systematic Regularisation Programme where occupiers of properties within planned, undocumented layouts in the State are given opportunity to apply to regularise their ownership rights to obtain a new digital C-of-O after KADGIS and KASUPDA have reviewed and approved such layout. Also, there is the Regular Application for Right of Occupancy where an applicant who has never held a Right of Occupancy for any property he claims or occupies, can use this application process to obtain a new grant of Right of Occupancy and then the application for a Direct Allocation application of land, which from time to time the Kaduna State government considers for allocation to applicants".

It is worthy of note that on assumption of office, the Governor, Senator Uba Sani graciously approved the downward review of the processing fee for the Recertification programme to N20,000.00 for those without assignment and 40,000.00 for those with assignment. Furthermore, in his kind response to the passionate appeals of holders of statutory right of occupancy, the Governor has incentivized it by extending the registration up to May 2025 and rescinded the penalties imposed on it to give room for title holders who were not able to register before to do so.

Also, on regularization, Sen. Uba Sani made a downward review on the penalty charges from the N500,000 being paid in the past to less than 50% of the fee. This is a deliberate gesture to ease the burden of occupiers of such areas for the regularization program to get titles for their property faster and at affordable fee. This is being implemented in phases for 25 urban areas across the state. Additionally, the Governor approved a 15 per cent discount on ground rent and land use charges for anyone who makes early payment as well as installment payment options for customers in high debt and a 20 per cent discount for advance payment for five years. Presently, a total of 4,089 offers have already been generated while over 5,000 plots of land have been allocated to public servants, individuals, political appointees and private business owners by the present administration.

As part of Governor Uba Sani's administrations efforts of upgrading existing settlements to a certain standard that will help in urban planning, population management, help existing structures to acquire their digital Certificate of Occupancy as well as also assist in providing information that will help in managing security challenges, the Kaduna State Government is creating layouts in the state. Thus, areas acquired by government for this development, the affected claimants are being compensated while affected owners of houses or properties in the area, are be integrated into such layouts. This is aimed at preventing any likelihood of land disputes by claimants of area where a layout is established and avoid the accumulation of unsettled compensations as the present administration is currently and gradually clearing up the backlog of compensations of areas acquired

On borrowing for development

irst of all, I want to assure you that since our inception one year and five months ago, we have not borrowed a penny from the government. The reason we have accomplished much in education, health, and infrastructure is our belief that the government can develop if unnecessary spending is reduced. Therefore, since we assumed office, no cars have been provided to anyone—from myself as governor to the deputy governor, commissioners, and members of parliament. The allowance given to the commissioners, advisers, and myself have been reduced. I have been receiving half of my salary since becoming the Governor of Kaduna State because we need to use our resources to benefit the community.

Insecurity incidents subsiding in Kaduna

Recently, I informed the president that the security situation in Kaduna State has improved. We have stood firm and collaborated with security forces, including the army, police, and DSS. We also engaged with stakeholders in Kaduna State, such as chiefs and religious leaders, and we all cooperated effectively. As you know, the security issue is not only for security officers; it should involve everyone if we want to see

For example, i went to Birnin-Gwari last month to flagg off-road construction and other infrastructure projects, and was told that for more than 7-8 months, there has been no terrorist activity on the road from Kaduna to Birnin-Gwari. Previously, people were taken daily, but now this issue has subsided, and there is no problem.

On Kaduna's financial capability to sustain itself

Alhamdulillah, we are trying. Since our inception, 62 roads have been constructed, totalling 700 kilometres in length. Some of these projects have already been completed. Twelve out of thirty of our major local government hospitals have been demolished. We are constructing new ones and equipping them with modern facilities.

Additionally, we are building three vocational training centres, which are unique in this country. We have purchased 100 CNG buses to assist the community due to the current high living conditions, allowing civil servants to use these buses for free. We are undertaking these initiatives to support our community.

Last month, we also distributed 500 trailer loads of fertilizer to benefit 120,000 small farmers. Despite these works, we did not borrow a single Naira.

overnor Uba Sani has said that his vision is to build healthy communities where the poor and vulnerable have access to quality healthcare in Kaduna State.

The governor, who said that his administration is carrying out a surgical operation in the healthcare sector, pledged "to deliver to our people a healthcare system that addresses the needs of the citizens in the three levels of healthcare delivery.

"This vision is structured around five strategic objectives: enhancing health infrastructure, improving service delivery, strengthening human resources for health, ensuring the availability of essential medicines, and increasing sustainable health financing," he added.

Governor Uba Sani, who made this

known at the commissioning of the remodelled Dabo Mohammed Lere Memorial Hospital, Saminaka, on Wednesday, said the event was "not just the transformation of a building but the fulfilment of our promise to the good people of Lere Local Government."

According to him, the commissioning aligns with the administration's broader initiative to renovate and upgrade secondary healthcare facilities throughout the state, ensuring that our healthcare system is robust, responsive, and ready to meet the needs of the people.

"The remodelled Dabo Mohammed Lere Memorial Hospital that we are gathered to commission will rank as one of the best equipped general hospitals in Nigeria," he said. The Governor disclosed that the hospital has a General Outpatient Department (GOPD) and Pharmacy, a fully equipped administrative building, and a state-of-the-art dental clinic.

He also said that the Dabo Mohammed Lere Memorial Hospital boasts modern laboratory and radiology services as well as a comprehensive maternity complex, amongst other facilities.

"Our administration is dedicated to ensuring that every community has access to healthcare facilities that are not only functional but also equipped with modern amenities and technology to provide excellent care", he further said.

Reindustrialization of the North, key to youth restiveness – Northern Governors Forum

Being a communique of the Northern States Governors' Forum meeting with Chairmen of Northern States Council of Emirs and Chiefs held on monday 28th October, 2024 in Kaduna

Northern States Governors'
Forum and Northern
Traditional Rulers' Council (Emirs
and Chiefs) was held Monday 28
October, 2024. The meeting was also
briefed on the security challenges in
the north by the Chief of Defence Staff,
General Christopher Musa. The
meeting deliberated extensively on
matters of common interest and issued
the following communique:

- 1. Forum extends its deepest sympathies to the victims of the recent flood disasters in Maiduguri and other parts of the North, as well as to the families affected by the tragic tanker explosion in Jigawa State. The Forum equally commiserates with other victims of terrorism, banditry and similar criminal activities in the North and Nigeria at large and stand in solidarity with them during these difficult times. We agreed to continue to work with the Federal Government and relevant agencies to provide the necessary support and relief to those affected.
- 2. Forum emphasises that Traditional Institutions are critical in the quest for lasting peace and security in the region. Forum also acknowledged their commitment in bridging the gap between the Government and the people. Forum advocates for increased roles for the Traditional Institutions to maximize cooperation with security agencies in the fight against kidnap for ransom, banditry, cattle rustling, communal clashes, farmers/herder clashes and other forms of criminality.

 3. Forum acknowledges the recent gains made against criminals,

especially the elimination of bandits

and terror leaders. However, we resolved to sustain these gains in order to ensure lasting peace and stability in the sub-region. Forum commended the Federal Government and security agencies for their commitment in ensuring that our communities are safe and secure. Particularly we commend the untiring commitment of the Chief of Defence Staff General C. J Musa whose professionalism and innovative approach has made difference in security architecture of the Country at large. Nevertheless, more need to be done to address pockets of challenges that abound in the Northern Region.

- 4. With the recent "End Bad Governance" protests that took place in August, the Forum resolved to scale up efforts to tackle the root causes of youth restiveness by investing in education, skills development, job creation and pathways for the youth to chanel their energy into productive ventures, thereby reducing their vulnerability to crime and social vices.

 5. Forum resolves to call on the Federal
- 5. Forum resolves to call on the Federal Government and relevant Agencies to urgently address the current electricity power blackout affecting most of the

Northern States due to vandalization of electricity transmission infrastructure. This matter not only underscores the vulnerability of critical infrastructure, but also the need to build additional transmission lines and diversify our energy supply so as to better connect our region and improve our energy resilience.

6. Forum agrees that Northern Nigeria holds immense agricultural potentials, which, if fully harnessed, can significantly alleviate hunger and boost economic growth. To achieve this, we resolved to provide adequate support to our farmers, including access to financing, modern farming techniques and infrastructure such as roads and irrigation systems. Agriculture should not only be seen as a means to feed our people but also as a catalyst for industrialization and job creation across the region. That can be achieved through re-industrialisation of the North especially by reviving the textile value chain and development of other agro-allied industries.

7. Forum commends His Excellency, the President and Commander-In-Chief of the Armed Forces of the Federal Republic of Nigeria for the reform initiative in the livestock subsector and agreed to provide the necessary political will and commitment to ensure the success of the Federal Government livestock development initiatives. The Forum also agreed to sustain engagement and cross-fertilization of ideas with the Presidential Livestock Reforms Implementation Committee to achieve greater results.

Sultan cautions against sermons that discourage female education

n a significant move to address the challenges of girls' education in Northwest Nigeria, traditional and religious leaders met at the Yar'Adua Hall in Kaduna for a one-day conference focused on improving adolescent girls' education access and completion rates in the region.

The Sultan of Sokoto, His Eminence Muhammad Sa'ad Abubakar, who was the special guest of honour, strongly advocated for girls' education, emphasizing that it aligns with Islamic teachings. He cautioned religious leaders against delivering misleading sermons that discourage girl-child education, stating that the Holy Quran encourages girl child education and emphasized that society stands to benefit when all its citizens are educated.

Deputy Governor Dr. Hadiza Sabuwa Balarabe, representing Governor Senator Uba Sani, revealed alarming statistics from the World Bank showing that Nigeria has one of the highest out-of-school populations globally, with 12-15 million school-age children currently not receiving education. The situation has been further complicated by security challenges in the North-West region, with an estimated one million children directly impacted by insecurity in 2020-



His Eminence Sultan of Sokoto 2021 alone.

Dr. Balarabe highlighted the significant role of the Adolescent Girls Initiative for Learning and Empowerment (AGILE) program, supported by the World Bank. The program, which initially covered seven states with a \$500 million credit incentive, has recently expanded to include eleven more states with an additional \$700 million approved in September 2023. This expansion aims to reach more out-of-school girls, including married girls and those living with disabilities.

"Education and skills are transformative tools essential for closing gender gaps, especially in economic and political empowerment, and for achieving Nigeria's full potential," stated Dr. Balarabe. She emphasized that with women comprising more than 49% of Nigeria's population, their educational needs cannot be ignored.



KDSG Promises Jobs, skills for released Kaduna protesters

Ahmed Tinubu's directives for the release of minors charged with treason for participating in protests against bad governance, Kaduna State Governor Uba Sani has ordered the safe evacuation of the vulnerable children, directing the Ministry of Human Services and Social Development to reunite them with their families.

Deputy Governor Dr. Hadiza Sabuwa Balarabe personally supervised their transfer to the Kaduna Foster Home on Katuru Road, marking a compassionate step towards healing and reintegration of the young individuals caught in the turmoil of societal unrest.

Governor Uba Sani in the meantime has promised to rehabilitate and empower the released protesters from Kaduna State, if they turned a new leaf and become responsible and law abiding members of the society.

Speaking to journalists after the protesters were released, the Secretary to Kaduna State Government, Dr Abdulkadir Muazu Meyere said that the Governor has asked him to receive the credentials of those who have completed their tertiary education.

According to him, the detainees were given a telephone each because they lost their own during detention and "the Governor has graciously given each of them N100,000 as a measure of goodwill."

Dr Meyere also said that the detainees have been transported back to their various homes.

Uba Sani aids rescue of 58 kidnap victims in Kaduna

t least 58 people who were kidnapped by bandits in Birnin Gwari local government Area of Kaduna State have been released.

They were released at about 3pm on Thursday, November 14, 2024, through the non-kinetic arrangement facilitated by the state Governor, Senator Uba Sani, in collaboration with the office of the National Security Adviser (NSA).

This was a significant operation, especially considering the surge in kidnappings in the area.

The General Officer Commanding (GOC) the One Mechanised Division, Major General Mayirenso Saraso, led the Joint

rescue mission, demonstrating Governor Sani's administration's commitment to tackling insecurity in Kaduna State using non-kinetic approach in collaboration with security agencies.

Upon their release, the rescued victims mainly children and women were taken to the office of the National Security Adviser, Nuhu Ribadu for debriefing after having undergone medical checkup. Forum acknowledges the fact that climate change has greatly affected our environment resulting in the recent flood incidents in many parts of the North and therefore resolved to partner with the Federal Government and other stakeholders to build irrigation infrastructure like canals and waterways to divert excess water and channel them towards irrigation activities, thus enhancing rural livelihoods and safeguarding food security.
- 9. Forum agrees to support and keyin to any initiative aimed at addressing the challenges of out-ofschool-children and improving educational outcomes in the sub-
- 10. Forum notes with dismay the content of the recent Tax Reform Bill that was forwarded to the National Assembly. The contents of the bill are against the interests of the north and other sub-nationals especially the proposed amendment to the distribution of Value Added Tax (VAT) to Derivation-based Model. This is because companies remit VAT using location of their headquarters and tax office and not were the services and goods are consumed. In view of the foregoing, the Forum unanimously rejects the proposed Tax Amendments and calls on members of National Assembly to oppose any bill that can jeopardise the well-being of our people.
- 11. For the avoidance of doubt, the Northern Governor' Forum is not averse to any policies or programmes that will ensure the growth and development of the Country. However, the Forum calls for equity and fairness in the implementation of all national policies and programmes so as to ensure that no geopolitical zone is short-changed or marginalised.
- 12. On the present economic hardship affecting the Country, the Forum is appealing to all citizens to remain calm, as the states and Federal Government are working hard to implement measures that will cushion effects of the hardship.

It collaborates with KADSUBEB, the Kaduna State Ministry of Education, the Kaduna State Bureau of Statistics, and the Kaduna State Schools Quality Assurance Authority to promote data-driven decision-making, enhance teaching methodologies, and refine assessments for foundational learning.

Stakeholders at the review meeting included Dr. Mikailu Ibrahim, Education Advisor (Window 2); Ms. Kate Ross, FCDO Education Advisor (UK); Mr. Joseph Wales, Education Advisor (Window 3); Mrs. Julia Patrick-Ogbu, PLANE Programme Manager; and the PLANE State Focal Person, Madam Diana Agabi, along with her team.

The session provided a platform to assess the progress made towards achieving the programme's objectives, share insights, and discuss strategies to overcome challenges and optimize outcomes.

KDSG's scorecard in the health sector

ver the period that he has been in office, the Governor of Kaduna State, Senator Uba Sani has demonstrated unwavering commitment to safeguarding the health of the residents of Kaduna State. This commitment is evident in various reforms and developments in the health sector which also align with the S U S T A I N A g e n d a o f h i s administration.

Since taking office on May 29, 2023, Governor Sani has embarked on a mission to revolutionize the healthcare delivery in Kaduna State through the SUSTAIN Agenda emphasizing the importance of investing in human capital development.

The Governor's health sector vision is to achieve Universal Health Coverage and promote healthy lives for all residents of Kaduna State. The Universal health coverage ambassador has deliberately structured this vision around five strategic objectives:

- (1) enhancing health infrastructure
- (2) improving service delivery
- (3) strengthening human resources for health
- (4) ensuring the availability of essential medicines, and
- (5) increasing sustainable health financing.

In the area of Infrastructure Development he has initiated an ambitious program to complete and inaugurate the 300-bed specialist hospital at millennium city before the end of 2024 precisely in the last quarter of 2024. The commissioning of the three hundred bed Hospital will revolutionize the health care, reduce medical tourism, and equip the state of-the-art oncology centre for research, diagnosis, and treatment of cancers.

Kaduna State investment in health infrastructure cuts across the spectrum of the primary, secondary

and tertiary facilities in the state. Consequently, the government is currently upgrading 9 General Hospitals - 3 in each senatorial district. In addition, thirty highvolume primary healthcare facilities are being upgraded into "centres of excellence," ensuring that residents, particularly in rural areas, have access to modern healthcare services. The completion of these thirty facilities exemplifies the commitment of the Governor's commitment to improving health infrastructure, which directly enhances the quality of care to the people of Kaduna State.

In its efforts to elevate health service delivery, the Kaduna State Government has distributed modern medical equipment to 290 upgraded PHCs, significantly boosting their capacity to provide quality care.

In addition, the Government has engaged 1,354 Community Health Influencers, Promoters and Service Providers (CHIPS) agents across 14 Local Government Areas, which has extended the healthcare services closer to the people.

The initiatives in maternal and child health have touched many lives, with over two million children having received Vitamin A supplements and more than 300,000 women and children benefiting from various reproductive, maternal, newborn, child, and adolescent health interventions.

At a recent interaction with the media where the strides of the Ministry of Health were highlighted, the indefatigable commissioner in charge of the ministry, Hajiya Umma K. Ahmed disclosed for instance that in recent time, Kaduna State Government has maintained low vaccine stock-out rates, achieving over 90% coverage during Supplemental Immunization Activities (SIAs), ensuring that children grow up healthy and protected.

In its commitment to vulnerable communities, the present Government has reached over 18,500

individuals with primary healthcare interventions in nine security-compromised Local Government Areas and successfully vaccinated over 102,000 eligible children during special interventions. This focused outreach demonstrates the Government's dedication to ensuring that even the most marginalized populations have access to essential healthcare services.

In its cautious service delivery efforts, the commitment to vulnerable communities, the state government has digitized 95% of State Primary Healthcare Board (SPHCB) staff data, marking a significant shift towards modernizing the health system management. This innovation enhances the ability to monitor and improve service delivery, for the health benefit of the citizens of Kaduna State. In the area of substance abuse, Government has established 17 PHCbased Drop-In Centers which provided screening, brief intervention, counselling, supportive care interventions and referral services for substance use disorders and mental ill health to 2,095 people.

These achievements reflect Governor Uba Sani's vision, political will, and the tireless efforts of Kaduna State's health team led by Hajia Umma to ensure the well-being of residents in the State. Kaduna State Ministry of Health will continue to build on these successes, as it priorities for 2024-2027 will focus on enhancing service delivery, strengthening human resources, ensuring the availability of medicines, and securing sustainable health financing with the overall goal to reduce maternal and child mortality in Kaduna State. Uba Sani pushes worker-welfare ...

In another development, Staff of the Kaduna State Water Corporation and their relatives have praised Governor Uba Sani for being magnanimous enough to clear the backlog of their N800 million salary arrears.

Speaking to journalists Wednesday, some staff who do not want to be named, said that nonpayment of salaries preceded the coming of his administration but the past government did not address the problem.

They said that the Governor could have chosen to sweep the matter under the carpet but he decided to address the issue once and for all, adding that "he has shown that he has the milk of human kindness in him..

"Judging from his policies and programmes, Governor Uba Sani has demonstrated that he has the plight of workers and the common man at heart. His rural transformation programme and the revamping of the education sector, as well as healthcare show that he is a people's Governor," one female staff said.

It will be recalled that the Commissioner of Public Works and Infrastructure, Arc Ibrahim Hamza, has said that the Governor had directed that the backlog of the salaries of KADSWAC staffwill be cleared in four tranches.

According to him, Kaduna State is investing heavily on the rehabilitation and retrofitting of all water treatment plants and distribution mains, with emphasis on sanitation and hygiene.

The Commissioner of Works further disclosed that "previous administrations invested \$500 million into the urban water supply scheme in the last 10 years with no result."

"Rather, capacity utilisation dropped down from 43% in 2017 to 8% in 2023 with 5% coverage," he added.

According to Arc Hamza, the refund of N17.2 billion was not duly utilised by the previous administration and institutional reforms culminated in redundancy and laying off of skilled staff.

'Why Sexual Offenders Registry is necessary'

aduna State Government has said that the aim of the Sex Offenders Database is to name and shame convicts and that already, over 37 persons have so far been convicted.

The Director of Special Investigations, Mr Ayiku Thomas, disclosed this at a training on "Pathways to Inclusive Justice on Gender-Based Violence", which held at Holiday Conference Hotel, Kaduna.

Mr Thomas who is the lead for the Sexual Offenders Registry and Database in the Ministry of Justice, further said that the aim of making the information accessible to everyone is to curb the problem.

The training was organised by Kaduna State Government, in collaboration with Hadis Foundation, with the High-Level Multi-Agency Task Force, known as HI-MAT, and the Service Provider Accountability Response Committee (SPARC), essential for the establishment of the registry and database for sexual offenders.

Speaking at the training, Rashida Mahmud, the Chief Operating Officer of Hadis Foundation, said "we have successfully established Sexual Assault Referral Centres (SARCs) operational in Kwara State."

"In 2020, we worked on popularising the Violence Against Persons Prohibition Law (VAPP) in states like Kaduna and Kwara. We are now collaborating with the Ministry of Education to promote gender equity and social inclusion across the three senatorial districts," she added.

The Sexual Offenders Database (SOD) will serve as a public register containing profiles of convicted sex offenders in the state, aimed at deterring potential perpetrators by increasing accountability.

This initiative aligns with the National Sexual Offenders Register under Nigeria's National Agency for the Prohibition of Trafficking Persons (NAPTIP).

The launch of the Sexual Offenders Database is anticipated to significantly impact the fight against sexual violence in Kaduna State, paving the way for a safer environment for all citizens.

The conference was the first of its kind that attracted top religious clerics from different parts of the Northern States, coordinated by the Director General Bureau of Interfaith Barr. Tahir Umar Tahir, under the SUSTAIN Agenda of Governor Uba Sani.

The DG Interfaith explained that the Conference was aimed at bringing together key stakeholders from the 19th Northern States such as government officials, traditional and religious leaders, academics, civil Society organisations and international experts, to discuss and develop strategies to mitigate impact of climate change on peace and security in the region.

Governor of Kano State Malam Ibrahim Shekarau, were also among other special guests at the occasion.

He described climate change as not just an environmental crisis but profound challenge that can destabilize nations, worsen inequalities, and provoke violence.

The Sultan of Sokoto Alhaji Sa'ad Muhammad Abubakar III in his remarks advised Nigerians to stop castigating their leaders but to pray for them and the country, as nothing good or bad lasts forever.

He also cautioned religious leaders against misleading people for their personal gains.

He stressed, "Do your best in

worshiping Allah (God) and leave the rest to Him, not to anybody. Don't follow those who will lead you astray. So many things have been happening in this country, and we believe we must return to Allah."

CAN President, Dr. Daniel C. Okoh, noted that climate change was a reality in the North, He described it as a humanitarian crisis that required urgent attention.

The CAN president called for urgent solutions to all sources of conflict, including poverty, inequality, and lack of access to resources. He stressed the need to educate the public about the impacts of climate change and the importance of environmental stewardship.

The CAN president joined the Sultan in urging leaders to tell the truth to their communities, affirming that Nigeria, a nation of deep religious conviction, can only succeed by praying and seeking divine assistance.

Gov Uba Sani harps on vital role of Judiciary in fight against insecurity
