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As Kaduna State banishes violent crisis in 2024

ost followers of developments in Kaduna State will not fail to appreciate the recent report by the Kaduna State Peace Commission (KSPC) that the state has emerged from the year 2024 free of any violent crisis that in a few years gone by had claimed lives and property in huge figures.

To the residents of Kaduna State, the Commission's report was just an official attestation of what they have experienced in 2024: peace of mind, free of fearful thoughts about when "it" will happen again as they conduct their daily sustenance chores.

If anything, what the average citizen of Kaduna has grappled with in 2024 is the concerns of every other Nigerian: how to come to terms with the harsh economic realities occasioned by the new economic reform measures of the federal government which has spared only a negligible few.

It is true that in 2024 there have been pockets of kidnapping and banditry in the state some affecting hapless and vulnerable young ones the easy targets for bandits and their ilk who were always on the prowl for such soft targets that fetch ransom. But even such tendencies had been curtailed during the year mostly through non-kinetic approach.

What then could have made 2024 a significant year for Kaduna State free of echoes of war cries of the ethno religious type or its farmers-herders clone?

The magic wand has simply been the new approach to tackling violent conflicts propelled by a strong political will that carried

all along on the road to the attainment of a peaceful coexistence where everyone was an equal stakeholder. The approach entailed dialogue amongst all segments of the society where old foes were convinced it would pay them better to sit down on peace mats or at tables to dialogue. They concurred with the current leadership, the result being the peace that has returned to most of the communities in Kaduna State that were at daggers-drawn a situation which even made it impossible for them to confront common enemies in the twin monsters of banditry and kidnapping. Now all those communal animosities have given way to on atmosphere of forgiveness, cooperation and empathy for one another which is translating into noticeable rise in the tempo of commercial activities. This is evident in, for instance, the reopening of the popular Kara livestock market in Birnin Gwari LGA and the Kidandan market in Giwa LGA, both closed down for nearly a decade over security concerns which are now open to business and are beehives of commercial activities already.

A member of the **Kaduna Outlook** Editorial Committee, Nasir Dambatta has followed with keen interest the KSPC pronouncement of a clean slate of violent events in the state during the year and had drawn his conclusions as to why 2024 has been significant for Kaduna State and in particular its number one citizen whose political sagacity as manifest in the peace dialogues he initiated appears to have banished, at least for now, the wind of violent conflicts that does not blow anybody any good:

aduna State has achieved a milestone that many regions in Nigeria and beyond can only dream of: a year entirely free from violent conflicts. 3. Focus on Addressing Root Causes of Violence



overnor Uba Sani's first action on assumption of office was the signing of an Executive Order for the immediate financial inclusion of the over 2.1 million underserved and vulnerable citizens of Kaduna state who, hitherto, had been excluded from financial services. This action left no one in doubt about the governor's determination to frontally and consequentially address the problem which had denied his citizens access to



Social Intervention Programmes of the state and federal government and which affected its efforts at poverty alleviation.

The programme is one of the focal directions of his government's broader economic empowerment agenda.

But without the survey by the Kaduna State Bureau of Statistics into the Kaduna State Financial Inclusion Programme, Governor Sani would never be in an authoritative position to assess the success or otherwise of the programme and the bottlenecks if any that need to be addressed to ensure the attainment of the objective.

This is the justification for statistics which according to Stephen Senn, tells you "what you have done wrongly or how you could have done it better".

This is exactly what the Kaduna State Bureau of Statistics has done for Governor Sani by undertaking surveys, not just into the Kaduna State Financial Inclusion programme, but into other critical areas like the Kaduna State Population Dynamics which will provide invaluable data on the state's demographic patterns, and serve as a solid foundation for effective resource allocation, and long-term planning; the Annual School Census of 2023/2024, which looked not only into the government's efforts in improving the educational

sector but enrollment, school performance, infrastructural development, and other critical challenges that government needed facts to urgently address to ensure quality learning. The survey into Citizen Perception of the Kaduna State Contributory Health Management Authority (KADCHMA) Health Contribution Scheme 2024, which is key to improving the state's health contribution scheme, and ensuring better healthcare access for all, and the SDGs Watch 2023 which has tracked the state's progress towards achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), and ensuring that the states efforts remained aligned to the global standards, are all geared towards the same objectives. Kaduna State Government has no rival in Nigeria in waging a sustained war on the dearth of figures for planning due to the numerous advantages it has gained. This explains its continued investment in establishing a vibrant State Statistical System. For example, Kaduna State using concrete evidence drew valid conclusions in drawing up its Development Plan which reflects its policy priorities, and the government aspirations to be the investment destination and food basket for Nigeria. In line with the survey that about 80 to 85 percent of its 15 billion GDP is accounted for by agriculture, which also accounts for 42.7 percent of total employment of its people, the government has unequivocally anchored its development strategy on agriculture due to its capacity to provide employment for its teeming youth population, ensure food security and as a source of raw materials for agro-processing industries.

The point is that Kaduna State's economic development strategy is based on reliable statistics. So what would the state gain from understanding its demographic structure? Apart from helping it in critical planning and governance, the report provides essential data on its growing population, migration patterns, and the characteristics of households. Armed with dependable data, the Governor Sani administration is better positioned to anticipate future needs in education, healthcare, housing, and infrastructure. In the preparation of the annual budgets, resources are allocated more effectively to ensure that no one is left behind and that incidences of abandoned projects are a thing of the past.

For the Uba Sani administration, education remains a top priority. The benefit of the Annual School Census for the state is that it would help the government to objectively monitor the state of the schools, including student enrolment, teacher availability, and infrastructural needs.

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Keying Up Kaduna

overnor Uba Sani's clear desire is to make Kaduna State fully functional by unlocking and nurturing the potentials that are necessarily required for development. As the governor and therefore the holder of the key to the future of the state, he is in a position to push it up to the desired level.

The governor is, in other words, effectively keying up Kaduna State to enable it recover lost grounds in the areas of security, peaceful co-existence and infrastructure. All his efforts are geared towards the attainment of unprecedented success in the delivery of critical services that can guarantee salvation and prosperity for the state.

Quite apparently, Governor Sani rightly considers peace and security as the foundation of progress and therefore consistently works for the creation of an atmosphere that will allow for an unhindered performance of government. This is a development that is desperately needed for the implementation of the 2025 budget that has just been signed into law by the governor. The sustenance of the rural transformation drive on which the budget focuses will be possible only in an atmosphere that is devoid of hostilities and resultant violence.

In less than two years that he has been in power, Governor Sani has resuscitated dashed hopes and repaired broken hearts thereby making the entire state a highly prosperous environment towards which all seekers of peace and fortunes have continued to gravitate. What is happening in Kaduna State is a speedy return of activities in both formal and informal sectors, thanks to all the efforts of the governor who has vowed to make it greater; far greater than it has ever been.

Uba Sani was recently at TVC where he responded to questions on the state's amnesty programme for bandits:



TVC Anchor: Thank you for joining us today, I would like to dive right into the controversy surrounding the State government's amnesty program for bandits. One of the major arguments by critics is that this program ignores the victims of these terrorists and their actions. And instead provides incentives to the bandits themselves. How do you respond to these concerns?

Gov Sani: Thank you very much for having me, I can see that what they are talking about is more of a speculation and hearsay, because i was watching you people talk about the amnesty, but none of them bothered to enquire about the process; probably i would have called them insecurity merchant but i wont call them that, for now. The most important thing is that this process has been in place for the last six months. The day we had the first agreement in Birnin Gwari local government, I made it clear to everyone, that the process started about six months ago and of course if you watched what we did that day, you could see that there was a representative of the office of National Security Adviser and a representative of the Chief of Defence Staff...

All the relevant security agencies were there but some

All the relevant security agencies were there but some people are not really conversant with the law, the country and the Constitution. Of course they want to quickly come out and make statements without verification, without information.

Maybe they responded to or made their position out of ignorance, I don't want to say it's mischievous but out of ignorance. The most important thing is it was a result of alot of negotiations. We met at the palace of the Emir of Birnin

Gwari and it's a procedure that is done local government by the local government in Kaduna state.

The other day another team went to Giwa local government. We will head to Kachia local government in the next two weeks so there are a lot of local governments that have security challenges in Kaduna state. There are about six local governments. But there are also many local governments in Kaduna State that have never known banditry and have no idea about the insecurity of the other local governments in Kaduna state. Just six local governments in the state are effected by insecurity and if you go to some local governments you talk to them about insecurity, they will have no clue what you are talking about, because they go to their farm and run their businesses no kidnapping, no banditry. Of course government did not just go in there, the communities sought it.

In Kaduna State since i was elected we have State Security Council where traditional rulers, religious leaders, all the security agencies, local government chairmen, elected members of the state assembly, youth leaders, women leaders, community leaders are members who always hold meetings both at the local government level and at the state level.

So it is as a result of that the communities particularly in Birnin Gwari approached me and complained that they were one of the local governments in Kaduna state that have a lot of farmers but in the past two years they could not go to their farms, so were suffering. They wanted a way out, knowing my powers under the Constitution, approached the office of the National Security Adviser and all the necessary security agencies, and asked for the security reports and the intelligence put in place.

I am the Governor of Kaduna state but as the Constitution of Nigeria stipulates I as the Governor don't have power over the military or the police. But as Chief Security Officer of the state, what is more important to me is the peace of the people in my own state, that is what informed my decision.

I don't care about the people that complained, they do not engage with the victims, I engaged with the victims in Birnin Gwari just as I'm going to other parts of Kaduna State to sit down with other communities on the way forward

ow has Governor Uba Sani's 2024 budget of "Rural Transformation for Inclusive Development" performed? It would also help the government evaluate whether it got value for money or not in delivering the outcomes (social contract) promised its citizens in the year under review. Performance review equally offers the government a basis for comparisons, between the anticipated desired results and the actual performance.

Having laid the foundation and concluded that analyzing past performance serves as a take-off point for the succeeding budget because it offers Governor Sani a veritable opportunity to evaluate and to further improve in the subsequent budget let's attempt an honest assessment of Governor Uba Sani's 2024 budget which had a budget size of N458,271,299,477.66, a capital expenditure of N318,836,576,588.28 and recurrent expenditure of N139,434,722,889.38, a 69.57% capital to 30.43% recurrent expenditure ratios.

Governor Uba Sani despite the rising debt overhang has without no doubt performed creditably by innovatively delivering on his inclusive development by providing critical infrastructure, especially to the rural communities that had suffered neglect and in enhanced security. The graduates, led to the govt house by the Executive Secretary, of the board Professor Yahya Saleh Ibrahim, came with their parents. The beneficiaries comprised 20 medical doctors who completed their studies in Cuba, 14 nurses that finished from the Islamic University of Uganda, and a BSc Cybersecurity graduate from the University of Wollongong Dubai, identified as a person with disability.

Governor Sani's initiative reflects his

administration's commitment to bolstering healthcare services and promoting human capital development. KDSG cracks down on illegal schools

he Kaduna State Schools Quality Assurance Authority (KSSQAA) has embarked on actions to address the challenge of schools operating illegally in the state. Those affected are unregistered and schools operating without valid licenses. These actions align with the broader commitment of Governor Uba Sani, to prioritize education as a cornerstone of Kaduna State's development.

Governor Uba Sani has demonstrated an unwavering dedication to education by allocating 25% of the 2024 budget and 26.14% of the 2025

budget to the sector.

His administration has built and commissioned numerous educational facilities, significantly expanding access to learning opportunities across the state. However, beyond access, the Governor is equally committed to ensuring that the quality of education met both national and international standards.

The KSSQAA action followed the observation that despite robust advocacy and sensitization campaigns through various media, some school proprietors remained resistant to standardizing their operations. These unregistered and substandard schools undermine efforts to elevate Kaduna's educational standards and exploited parents by charging exorbitant fees for inferior services.

"Many of these schools lack essential infrastructure, employ unqualified teachers, and disregard approved curricula," said Prof. Usman Abubakar Zaria, Director-General of KSSQAA. "They fail to provide conducive learning environments, compromising the future of our children."

Kaduna State has recorded improvements in education outcomes, with 67% of learners achieving five credits, including Mathematics and English, in their NECO Senior Secondary Certificate Examinations

(SSCE), up from 54% before 2023.

While commendable, Prof. Abubakar Zaria emphasized that this progress is not enough. "We aim to be the leading state in educational performance, and this requires strict adherence to quality guidelines by all schools," he further said.

KSSQAA has completed Phase 1 of its enforcement exercise, targeting unregistered schools to ensure they either complied with regulations or cease operations. Preparations for Phase 2 are already underway, signaling the Authority's unwavering commitment to providing a safe and high-quality learning environment for every child in Kaduna State. In the coming weeks, KSSQAA will close down illegal schools that fail to meet the required standards, *Kaduna Outlook* has gathered.

KSSQAA has urged all stakeholders to join hands in safeguarding education in the state and called on parents and community members to report any suspected illegal schools to KSSQAA. It also called on registered schools to renew their annual operating licenses promptly. "Education is the most powerful equalizer in society," said Prof. Abubakar Zaria, adding that: "It is a sacred trust we must protect together. Let us work to make Kaduna State a beacon of educational excellence in Nigeria."

TVC Anchor: Mr. Governor the program you made reference to earlier, is an independent program on TVC and i saw that interview myself, one of the issues raised by one of the stakeholders i believe is the consultation process you talked about and particularly with Christian leaders, they are saying before embarking on this program, I'm sure you are aware there's a perceived religious undertone to the attacks on churches. Many religious leaders are against the pardon and armnesty... Is that something that you are willing to address?

Gov Sani: Okay as we speak just an hour ago the chairman of the Christian Association of Nigeria, Kaduna State branch was in my office, he is fully involved. You see maybe one or two people are not involved and they concluded that nobody was involved. The CAN Chairman of Kaduna State and I had a lot of consultations. Let me tell you since I became Governor of Kaduna State there has never been any community or religious crisis and some people are not happy about that, they want to couse religious tension.

Can they mention anybody from Birnin Gwari who has approached them and told them that, because I'm a Christian or a Muslim one of my persons has been killed, I want to challenge them to tell me one person, don't speak for the victims when you don't have facts.

When I went to Birnin Gwari the Emir of Birnin Gwari in his wisdom gathered everyone together and presented the security intelligence available. I looked at the report and spoke on it to everyone, nobody talked about religion. Those talking about religion are religious bigots in Kaduna.

TVC Anchor: Mr Governor I think the bone of contention here really has to do with the armnesty and pardon

component of the Kaduna model program, many have questions... For instance how you intend to achieve sustainable peace without justice for previous crimes, what do you have to say for instance to victims of crimes by the beneficiaries of this peace agreement, what measures are in place to ensure justice at for the victims?

Gov Sani: We have a committee jointly between the Kaduna State government, the National Security Adviser, all the relevant security agencies in Kaduna State and the federal level... what we are doing is, if anyone comes out with cases about injustice against him, the government not only of Kaduna State but the Federal Government, jointly will look at the issue critically and address the issue but as at this moment, no one has come to me. Tell me one person you are aware of who has killed anyone. I've spent the most part of my life as a civil rights activist. Most of the people speaking, don't know my antecedent, I've fought for democracy, I've fought for justice, I've fought for Nigeria. I went to detention so many times fighting for the less privileged and the vulnerable and voiceless in Nigeria. That is my record, most of them never had something like that in their life so what I'm talking about is if there's any case of injustice someone should report to me... I will always insist that those that are responsible for loss of lives and property be brought to justice.

And I have made it clear that instead of people going to the media to talk, they should approach me with the facts. I'll repeat, please if there's anybody that has any issue that wants us as a government to take actions... But I cannot do anything without information let us know. I've fought hard for my people even before I became Governor.

Uba Sani raises retirement age for Kaduna academics

ov Uba Sani of Kaduna, has issued an executive order increasing the retirement age of the academic staff of some Kaduna state-owned tertiary institutions to 65. Prof Muhammad Sani Bello, the state's commissioner for education, said that the decision followed a meeting with the governor, tertiary institutions managements, and the leadership of academic staff unions of all state-owned tertiary institutions.

The commissioner, while speaking during a news briefing on Friday, said

the retirement threshold is subject to some requirements.

He said the academics made five demands that the governor pledged to fulfil over time.

He said this included the issue of retirement age which he said would be resolved within 48 hours.

The order, he said, raised the retirement age of academic staff of Nuhu Bamalli Polytechnic Zaria, College of Education Gidan Waya, and School of Nursing and Midwifery to 65 years

Prof. Bello said the Kaduna state government was committed to ensuring the smooth implementation of the policy across state-owned tertiary institutions.

He said the order came into effect last

Thursday, the day it was signed.

Recalling the other issues discussed at the meeting, the commissioner said that the governor noted that a series of the requests had been lingering before the coming of his administration.

"There were five fundamental requests. Number one had to do with outstanding salaries and welfare benefits of the staff of these institutions. On that, His Excellency has graciously agreed to consider those outstanding payments and benefits," he said.

"But of course, given the financial constraints that the state is facing, affordable amounts would be paid in staggered form until the outstanding liability is redeemed. That was the resolution," he said.

"Kaduna State Civil Service one of the most vibrant"

aduna State has one of the most vibrant civil services in the country as other states regularly send delegations to understudy some of the operations of key areas especially accountability.

This was disclosed at a two-day capacity building workshop which was organised by the office of the Head of Service and the Principal Private Secretary to Governor Uba Sani, held from 4th to 5th December in Kaduna.

A communique issued after the workshop noted that Kaduna State Public Service is strictly guided by "Scheme of Service, Stores Regulations, The Guide to Administrative Procedures and Financial Instructions."

The communique recommended that the Department of Printing Services (Government Printer) should produce these Statute/Regulatory Books for sale to Public Servants at affordable fees to enable more civil servants acquaint themselves for the continuous knowledge and growth of the service.

The communique jointly signed by Alhaji Waziri Garba and Malam Ibraheem Musa, the Senior Special Assistant on Administration and the Chief Press Secretary to the Governor respectively, stated that the capacity building was organized for employees of Government House as ambassadors of government to equip them support the government in its bid to deliver on its campaign promises.

Participants at the workshop commended Kaduna State Government, under the leadership of Senator Uba Sani, for organising the workshop, which they described as " the first of its kind in the history of the state."

Governor Uba Sani was particularly applauded for his leadership style which emphasises inclusion, propeople policies, workers' welfare and training, adding that trainings and workshops should be conducted for all categories of civil servants on a continuous basis.

Academics, technocrats and bureaucrats as well as senior government officials presented papers at the workshop on diverse topics and interactive sessions followed the presentations.

According to the communique, Kaduna State Government is a "trailblazer in reforms but notwithstanding, the Civil Service Commission and the office of the Head Of Service are still improving on the recruitment process and the service generally."

The communique disclosed that "Kaduna State has one of the most robust Procurement Laws in the country, which is in line with international best practices.

"Kaduna State and Lagos States are the only sub-nationals that have a Gender Responsive Policy, which waives the Kaduna State Public Procurement Authority (KADPPA) registration fees for women-owned businesses.

"The KADPPA non-refundable Tender Fees have also been reviewed downwards by 50% for all womenowned businesses. Also, womenowned businesses are only required to pay 50% of the registration fees for Ministries, Departments and Agencies," The communique said

Political Appointees were also advised to "desist from random and irresponsible posts on social media because such comments—can be misconstrued as the viewpoint of Government, thereby causing reputational damage or public outcry." The communique stated that "Public Servants must be disciplined, loyal to the Government of the day, show courtesy in the discharge of their duties, cooperate with one another and be honest in all their official engagements.

"It is also essential for Public Servants to adhere to laiddown procedures in the conduct of Government business as failure to do so leads to systemic decay of the service and corruption."

The communique noted that "Information and Communication

With this data, the government is better positioned to tackle the challenges of access and quality, that would ensure that every child in Kaduna State receives the qualitative education that they deserved to become part of the knowledge-based economy of the 21st century.

budgets fail. The reports on abandoned projects have squarely showed that the lack of statistics for planning, not funding, is the main culprit. For instance, there is no denying the fact that infrastructure is crucial to Africa's growth prospects, nor can one ignore or deny the evergrowing need for the infrastructural improvement in Nigeria. But what we have constantly worked with are approximations, and not hard facts that are critical for planning. Despite the estimated shortfall of nearly \$100 billion in infrastructure investment in Africa, lack of financing is certainly not the biggest problem.

It will make a great difference to hear other state governments speak authoritatively that only 30 percent of the population has access to electricity and that only 10 percent has access to safe water and sanitation, like Kaduna State does, in the areas that it has embarked on survey. It is only then that budgets would achieve their objectives.

The Bureau is currently working on attracting more local and foreign investment to the agricultural sector with the survey on Re-Validation of Agricultural Investment Plan which would help government provide the much-needed impetus in the area of infrastructure, land availability and financing for both small-holder and large-scale farming in the state. To fill the gaping hole in the State's data, the Bureau has concluded plans to conduct a range of innovative new surveys in critical sectors – health, labour, living standards.

Kaduna State deserves commendation for institutionalizing the role of data in planning and monitoring of government policies because its objective is to improve the lives of the residents of the state, by providing comprehensive targets for all aspects of development and coordinating the efforts of all actors. If all goes well, Kaduna hopes to achieve its potentials by the 2030. The modest gains Kaduna State has recorded in its desire to achieve inclusive economic growth and socioeconomic transformation that translates into substantial improvements in the quality of lives of citizens, through higher productivity and competitiveness are attributable to planning and planning with hard facts

That, the official added, would attract both local and foreign investment. According to him, the PASS project would consolidate the gains of the Capacity Strengthening Project for the Kaduna State Ministry of Agriculture earlier funded by AGRA between 2019 and 2021.

He said the previous AGRA project led to the revival of the State Committee for Agriculture, the development of the first agricultural policy, and the evolution of an inclusive and participatory planning and budgetary process.

He explained that the project also led to the establishment of a database and the flagship initiative of the sector in the state.

Alhaji Dabo said:" The objective of PASS is to improve the state capability of local actors to implement evidence-based policies and strategies; implement programs, monitor them, and build resilience.

"It will establish an enabling and

overnor Uba Sani has promised that all the 255 Primary Healthcare Centers in Kaduna State will be remodelled and upgraded to Level 2 status as part of his administration's overhaul of the health sector.

The Governor further pledged that the upgraded PHCs will undertake management of uncomplicated diabetes, uncomplicated hypertension, resuscitation of severe asthma and assisted delivery as well as other essential services.

Governor Uba Sani disclosed this at the flag off of the distribution of free essential drugs and hospital equipment for the entire PHCs in the 23 local governments in Kaduna State, at Kachia town.

The Governor who said that the present 255 Primary Healthcare Centers in Kaduna State are the best in the country, added that his administration wants Kaduna State to be the leading subnational in healthcare delivery in the country.

"Last Thursday, Kaduna State emerged

Kaduna state has reduced its debt burden by N58.7 billion within a year during which it made sacrifices and pooled savings to find space within the budget to embark on many keu significant projects

Debt Restructuring: The state may have engaged in refinancing existing loans to lower interest rates and extend repayment terms, easing the debt burden.

These measures collectively facilitated the significant reduction in debt over the past year.

The Governor announced a budget package of N790billion for the 2025 fiscal year with N553billion of 70% of the budget earmarked for capital expenditure and N237 billion earmarked for the recurrent expenditure.

"But of course, given the financial constraints that the state is facing, affordable amounts would be paid in staggered form until the outstanding liability is redeemed. That was the resolution," he said.

"The next issue had to do with funding the institutions. We all know that since the implementation of the Treasury Single Account system in Kaduna State, tertiary institutions have been affected.

"They complained about funding which they require to run the day-today activities of the institutions.

"As a prelude to a complete reversal of the inclusion of tertiary institutions from TSA, His Excellency has also graciously agreed to commence sharing of the total revenue being collected by these institutions.

"There will be sharing formula within the first quarter of next year, that will be mutually agreed which will be fair to all parties."

2024 Hajj: Uba Sani praises Pilgrims Agency for great performance

overnor Uba Sani has commended the Kaduna State Pilgrims Welfare Agency for its exemplary performance during the 2024 Hajj exercise, which earned it praise across the board.

The Governor made the commendation

when the Board members of the Agency submitted the Hajj 2024 report recently. The Governor, while receiving the report, pointed out that the Pilgrims Agency completed the evacuation of all intending pilgrims to Makkah ten days before the closing of King Abdulaziz International Airport, which he described as unprecedented.

The Director-General interfaith, Barrister Tahir Tahir in an interview with the Government House media crew, recalled that all of Kaduna State's pilgrims landed directly at Madinah, spent four days in the city, and visited holy sites and historical places before proceeding to Makkah.

Barrister Tahir also pointed out that the pilgrims spent about a week in Makkah before going to Mina and subsequently proceeding to Arafat, adding that "His Excellency, Governor Uba Sani, was happy with this seamless process."

Meanwhile, the Kaduna State Pilgrims Welfare Agency has commenced the payment of N61,080 to each of the 6,239 pilgrims who performed Hajj through the state in 2023. These refunds were received by the agency from the National Hajj Commission of Nigeria (NAHCON).

NAHCON has explained that the refunds are due to an interruption in the electricity supply during the pilgrims'

stay at Mina, which affected the cooling systems and consequently caused inconvenience to the pilgrims.

A statement from by the Agency explained that each pilgrim will receive the sum of N61,080, and these funds will be disbursed directly into the accounts of the affected pilgrims. "We will do everything possible to ensure only verified pilgrims with bank account details receive the refunds," Malam Salihu S. Abubakar, at a meeting with the Local Government Pilgrims Registration Officers today.

The statement called on the affected pilgrims who have not yet submitted their details to approach their Local Government registration officers for documentation and verification. The details required for verification include international passports and bank account details.
