Gov Uba Sani receives rescued Kuriga students, cautions against unguarded statements

aduna State Governor Uba Sani on Monday 25th march 2024 received the rescued abducted students of Kuriga in Chikun LGA with a caution to members of the public to desist from giving undue publicity to incidents of insecurity to curb the menace.

He said that the unnecessary publicity to the cases often emboldened the perpetrators and hindered effective operations by security agencies.

Gov Uba Sani who received the rescued students in company of Deputy Gov Dr Hadiza Sabuwa Balarabe, the Speaker, Kaduna State House of Assembly, Rt. Hon. Yusuf Liman, and other senior government officials at Sir Kashim Ibrahim House extended a hearty welcome to the 137 Kuriga school children who were rescued after spending 16 days in captivity. A teacher, Malam Abubakar who was abducted along with the students however lost his life in captivity due to some health challenges he suffered.

General Officer Commanding 1 Division Nigerian Army, Major General Mayirenso Saraso who formally handed over 131 of Kuriga school children, comprising 76 girls, and 51 boys, said six of the students were on admission at a hospital being treated for some health issues. The Governor had said at the reception for the children "only one person has not returned, and that is the teacher. But all of the 137 children are safely back."

He thanked President Bola Ahmed Tinubu who has played a major role in organizing and supporting the entire security agencies in Nigeria to ensure the children are back.

The Governor explained that the school children were rescued by the military, in collaboration with local authorities from neighboring Zamfara State.

He expressed sadness that the teacher could not make it alive, following health complications while in the hands of his abductors.

Gov Uba Sani thanked the National Security Adviser, Malam Nuhu Ribadu, the Service Chiefs, Chief of Defence Staff, Gen. Christopher Musa and the Corps Marshal of the Nigerian Civil Defence who have all made important contributions.

"It is an organized effort by all the security agencies and Nigerians, who have been praying day and night and today God has answered our prayers." Gov Uba Sani said.

He stressed the need for caution, over the matter of security. "Since the return of the children on Sunday evening when I visited them, a lot of people have been asking questions on how this children were released, what happened.

"For us in Kaduna, what is more important to us is the safe return of our children. Today, the children are here, they will soon join their parents, families and that is more important as our role is to protect lives of citizens of the state." he declared adding that security remained number one on the agenda of his administration and should not be politicized.

"We have to be cautious, we should not publicise the issue of security in Nigeria, because any attempt to undermine security in Nigeria in the name of politics is jeopardizing the lives of citizens," he warned.

Uba Sani assured that the rescued children who had undergone medical checks upon arrival will continue to undergo psychosocial counseling and proper medical supervision for sometimes.

The General Officer Commanding 1 Division Nigerian Army, Major General Mayirenso Saraso had said that both kinetic a n d n o n - k i n e t i c approaches were adopted in the rescue operation of the children.

According to him, the sustained and coordinated application of both kinetic and non-kinetic efforts by the security agencies under the strategic guidance of the President of the Armed Forces of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, President Bola Ahmed Tinubu GCFR through the Office of the National Security Adviser (ONSA), paid off.

"The students were initially received and administered first aid at the Nigerian Army Troops Forward Operating Base Dansadau, in Zamfara State before being served refreshment and subsequently conveyed from there under escort to Kaduna Sunday afternoon, the GOC added.

The 137 students of the Govt Secondary and LEA Primary Schools Kuriga in Chikun LGA of Kaduna State were successfully rescued from captivity around Dansadau Forest in Zamfara State and safely brought back to Kaduna.

CGK GLOBAL, a waste management company with capacity to generate hydrogen and electricity wants to set up a plant in Kaduna with the possible injection of 350 Million Dollars. Two ABU DHABI based companies. Masdar and Taqa expressed interest in collaborating with the Kaduna State Government in the areas of power

generation and distribution using gas.

On Establishment of Mining Infrastructure Fund

PASKO Limited, a South Korean international mining company with specific interest in lithium wants to invest in Kaduna State. Another international mining consortium, TROVEC Group expressed interest in collaborating with the Kaduna State Government in prospecting, exploring and exploiting different mineral deposits, as well as the establishment of a Mining Infrastructure Fund.

Boost to Health Care Delivery

Together with the Honourable Minister of Health, Prof. Ali Pate, we paid a visit to one of the leading hospitals in Qatar, Sidra Hospital located in Doha, to study its healthcare model and explore the possibility of

forging a partnership with the Hospital to boost healthcare delivery in Kaduna State. In particular, we held discussions on a cooperative agreement in respect of the running of the state of the art 300-bed Kaduna Specialist Hospital.

On Leyland assembly Plant, Mando Mechanic Village, Commercial Rice Farm

In the area of Agriculture, we held a meeting with the Managing Director of STALLION GROUP Nigeria to finalize discussions on the establishment of a 100,000 - hectare rice farm, as well as the setting up of an Assembly Plant for Ashok Leyland in Kaduna. We also held a meeting with representatives of a Qatar based Real Estate Company, Dream Construction, that expressed interest in partnering with the Kaduna State Government to develop the Mando Mechanics Village.

overnor Uba Sani has launched the second phase of the distribution of palliatives in the state announcing that the state Government was spending cumulatively over N11.4bn on palliatives under the phase.

Launched at the Murtala Square on Monday (18/3/2024) were 128 Trucks of Rice and Maize worth N3.4bn for distribution to the poor, vulnerable and underserved citizens of Kaduna State. Nearly one million persons in 200,000 households would benefit from the assorted grains distribution which had since left for the various Local Government Areas, the Governor added.

He announced other intervention programmes aimed at bringing succour to the less privileged in the state to include cash grants, agricultural inputs and implements to small-holder farmers, small and medium scale enterprises

(MSMEs) Persons With Disability, Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs), Orphans, Market Women and Youths at the total cost of N4.2bn.

The Governor said that a total of 9,800 poor and vulnerable households including 1000 persons living with disability have started drawing N50,000 each from the money earmarked for them, while release had also commenced of grants to 7,500 MSMEs with beneficiaries receiving between 100,000 to 1,000,000 naira depending on the sizes of the businesses. A total of 5,091 farmers, he further said, were receiving fertilizer and other farm inputs under the second phase of the exercise.

The Governor recalled that the sum of N3.3bn had been released for payment of pension and gratuities, and death



benefits to a total of 1,338 beneficiaries who had since been receiving their entitlements adding that civil servants have also started benefitting from a N500m revolving loan scheme introduced by government to ease the burden on deserving workers.

"We shall continue to take measures necessary to bring succour to the poor and vulnerable in our state", Governor Saniassured and

emphasized that "In the next two months, we shall c o m m e n c e t h e implementation of the 3rd phase of our palliatives programme".

The Governor warned that while the trucks conveying the assorted grains to various locations in the state were on their way, any attempt to divert or tamper with the consignments will be met with the full force of the law.







Uba Sani, others sympathise with Kuriga community

Governor Uba Sani was on a visit to Kuriga in Chikun Local Government Area where bandits had abducted primary school pupils and secondary school students to sympathise with parents and elders of the community. Other prominent people have either visited the community or the Governor to express their sympathies on the sad incident:

was at the Palace of the District Head of ▲Kuriga, Alhaji Lawal Abdullahi to receive full briefing on the March 8th unfortunate incident at LEA Primary and Secondary School, Kuriga. I also addressed members of the community who came out in large numbers to welcome us and express their grief. I learnt from members of the community that a valiant Vigilante member who confronted the bandits unfortunately lost his life.

I have briefed Mr. President and the National Security Adviser on the Kuriga situation. I received strong assurances from them that all measures are being taken to bring back the pupils and students. A Security Committee will be established in Kuriga, with

membership drawn from key stakeholders in Kuriga community, Security Agencies, and the State Government. I will make a strong case to the Chief of Defence Staff and Chief of Army Staff for the establishment of a Military Base in Kuriga to strengthen security in the area.

The unfortunate Kuriga incident reinforces our positions in support of the establishment of State Police. With State Police, there will be a standing Police Force in Kuriga drawn from members of the community who understand the terrain, the people and the issues at play. They can gather intelligence with ease. They will also be constitutionally empowered to bear arms, including sophisticated ones. This is important because Vigilante Groups are not allowed to carry arms. They are always at the mercy of these criminal elements who have scant regard for human life.

I have spoken with the IGP Inspector General of Police, as you know there is no single police station in Kuriga community and as you know the constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria even as a Governor you cannot establish a police station without the approval or permission of the IGP, and so I have spoken with him and I have showed him why we need permission to go and build a police station and he has approved of that.

Secondly, I have spoken with the Chief of Army Staff General Lagbaja to bring military base that



will cover the areas from Birnin Gwari, Buruku and Kuriga and he has also agreed with that. So, all these things as Governors we must seek approvals before we can do it because of nature of the constitution of our country.

Meanwhile, the United States Government has condemned the abduction of scores of school children and women in Kuriga 1, located in Chikun Local Government area of Kaduna State; it also declared support to government's rescue operations. While calling for prosecution of all perpetrators involved in the attack of the innocent pupils and students, the US expresed hope about "the immediate safe return of all taken".

The United States position was contained in a media statement issued by its Consulate in Nigeria.

"The United States strongly condemns the kidnapping of schoolchildren in Kaduna and displaced persons in Borno.

"Our hearts go out to the victims' families. We stand with you in demanding the perpetrators face justice and the immediate, safe return of all taken.

"We support Nigeria's efforts to secure their release," the statement added.

Nigeria Police Force

How a dollar will be N160 in Nigeria: A blueprint for economic resurgence

The recent free fall of the Naira, plummeting from N460 to a staggering N1,600 at the official rate, has cast a dark shadow over Nigeria's economic landscape. With inflation soaring from 22% to 30% within a year, the consequences are dire exacerbating poverty, fostering frustration, desperation, and fueling a surge in insecurity. The value of the Naira is the economic heartbeat of the nation, impacting the lives of every Nigerian. As the Naira weakens, so does the economic well-being of the average citizen.

In this critical moment, the responsibility to protect and restore the Naira rests not only on the government but on the shoulders of every Nigerian. While the government bears a significant share of the blame, the path to redemption lies in collective action. Drawing inspiration from past experiences in countries like Germany, Zimbabwe, and Venezuela, the key out is straightforward and common. Here's a comprehensive blueprint for restoring the Naira to a value of less than N200 per USD1.

Nigeria should first leverage foreign investment for large-scale agricultural production and solid minerals development. The oil sector is bringing foreign exchange because there is a massive foreign investment in the sector, so also, if we want to grow the Agricultural and Solid mineral sectors, large foreign investment must be injected into the sectors. Leasing agricultural fields to foreign investors, particularly for products with global demand, can stimulate economic growth. The federal and state governments must take the lead in the largescale production of these global cash crops. We have high-potential cash crops that can generate a significant inflow of foreign exchange to Nigeria.

For example, in 2022, Thailand generated up to \$9 billion from exports of Cassava alone. While Nigeria is the largest producer of cassava worldwide, a lack of storage and processing facilities results in the loss of more than 30% of the cassava produced, with the rest being consumed, contributing very little to our export basket.

There's no need to focus only on famous cash crops like Cocoa, Cotton, Ginger, Sesame, and Maize; there are other products like Cassia tora seeds, soybeans, palm oil, and others that also have high global demand. We can allocate a specific target of certain crops for some states, keeping a target export destination and quantity in mind.

Regarding solid minerals, state governments must play a vital role in attracting large investors to exploit the licenses they hold for large-scale mining. They also need to address illegal mining, which drives away legitimate large-scale

producers. The mining sector should be standardized, similar to the oil sector. One reason why state governments are not so active in the mining sector is the monthly allocation they receive from the federation, providing no incentive for the development of solid minerals. Allowing states more access to resources and powers and discontinuing or reducing federation allocations could encourage states to maximize the untapped potential in agriculture and solid minerals.

Another strategy is reducing importation through import substitution to reduce the importation of nonessential goods that can be produced locally so that we can conserve foreign exchange. For example, within just last year's second quarter (three months), we spent N3 trillion importing manufactured goods. Most of this bill could be substituted for locally produced goods or alternative demand. Within these three months, Nigerians spent N734 billion importing used cars. If we can build adequate mass transport systems, the demand for importation of used cars will reduce.

Currency swap is an option too, but in a different way. This type of currency swap arrangement is where Nigeria receives foreign currency at an agreed-upon rate in exchange for access to agricultural and mineral resources, addressing both economic and resource needs. No

country will agree to swap its currency for Naira, but many countries will accept swapping currency for agricultural and mineral resources.

Nigerians must stop treating the dollar like a commodity. Purchasing dollars not for any foreign transaction but solely to store value must be stopped. Nigerians, especially the wealthy and those in government, must refrain from converting their excess Naira to dollars for storage. Nigerians must be patriotic and sacrifice these illusion gains to save the Naira. The hoarding of dollars must be stopped by limiting the Naira in circulation, encouraging digital currency, and strictly monitoring cash movement.

There are more dollars in the hands of people than in the banks, which is why the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) cannot control the market. Since the CBN has limited control, Nigerians should only demand the dollar when there is a genuine need for it, specifically for foreign goods or services. Increased productivity, import substitution, and strict adherence to genuine demand for the dollar are

strict adherence to genuine demand for the dollar are essential. By doing so, the black market for dollars can be eliminated, as there will be enough dollars in the banking system to meet all legitimate demands.

The government must cut its spending and prioritize key areas. A reduction in the deficit will free up more foreign exchange for market control. The government must cease borrowing, as the burden of debt makes it difficult to control the exchange rate when some of the available

Notorious bandit, kidnapper,

Boderi killed

consistent support to security forces by Kaduna State Governor, Senator Uba Sani, a major breakthrough has been recorded in Nigeria's fight against banditry and terrorism, with the death in a gun battle of the notorious bandit, and ruthless killer, Boderi Isyaku. He was

killed along with some of his fighters by troops of the Nigerian Army around Budu/Riyawa general area of Chikun and Igabi LGA's,

recently.

Security report made available to the Kaduna State Governor Uba Sani said Boderi, as he was simply known, had for nearly a decade propagated a reign of fear, death and destruction in Kaduna State and neighboring Niger State, with a trademark of brutal attacks, mass abductions and cruel, ruthless killing.

His elimination came as the culmination of tireless efforts by dedicated troops committed to restoring peace and security in the region under the General Officer Commanding, 1 Division, Nigerian Army (and Force Commander, Operation Whirl Punch) Major General VU Okoro, who coordinated the operation.

According to a statement by S a m u e l A r u w a n, Commissioner overseeing Internal Security and Home Affairs, "the troops on Wednesday night, came in contact with Boderi and his fighters around Bada general area of Chikun LGA, and that despite the terrorists' well-fortified position, the troops laid a successful ambush resulting in Boderi and his associates being trapped.

The statement further said that, in the ensuing confrontation, Boderi chose to resist the troops and engaged them in a fierce gun fight. He was ultimately subdued, and his reign of terror ended in a burst of bullets and eternal ignominy. Two of his associates were likewise killed, the report added.

After the operation, the troops recovered two AK47 rifles, 300 rounds of ammunition, nine AK47 magazines, one magazine carrier, one Baofeng radio set and five motorcycles, it was gathered.

Boderi, known for his ruthlessness and cunning, had long eluded the grasp of security forces, while orchestrating the kidnappings of prominent figures, innocent civilians, school children and students with impunity. His activities not only caused untold pain to thousands of victims and families, but also posed a

neighbouring Niger State. His activities included vast and elaborate operations in cattle rustling and gunrunning. He was also known to have built a close rapport with terrorist groups, collaborating with them towards establishing footholds in these areas. Recent intelligence reports revealed his plans to attack a school in his sphere of operation which his death has now truncated.

Some of the acts of banditry perpetrated by Boderi includes 11th March 2021 abduction of 39 students of the Federal College of Forestry Mechanization, Afaka, Igabi LGA, which

generated s h o c k waves and m a s s i v e

panic around the country, as dozens of young students were whisked away and their families left to deal with unimaginable turmoil. He was also said to have masterminded another deadly attack, on the Afaka campus of the Nigerian Defence Academy, Igabi LGA. Two officers were killed and another abducted in 2021; weeks later, on 14th September 2021, Boderi led his gang of bandits in the kidnapping of the Emir of Bungudu, Alhaji Hassan Atto, around Dutse village, Chikun LGA, during which the Emir's Police Detail was killed.

Receiving the report, Governor Sani expressed his relief and happiness at the development, which he described as a pointer to the bravery and professionalism of the troops involved. The Governor commended Major General Okoro, for his stellar leadership, and praised the troops for their assertive victory.

Governor Sani assured security forces in Kaduna State of his unflinching support and readiness to sustain the current cooperation, for the successful achievement of their objectives.

The statement alerted the authorities and members of the public that some of Boderi's associates and gang members sustained gunshot injuries during that decisive encounter. Citizens in the general area and beyond are therefore enjoined not to render assistance (medical or otherwise) to individuals carrying such suspicious injuries, but to immediately report these persons to security agencies, on the following phone lines 09034000060 and 08170189999, all day.

dollars are used for debt servicing.

The CBN must halt the production of more Naira; making the Naira scarce could help improve its value. The scarcer the Naira, the more valuable it becomes. A scarcer and more valuable Naira will be critical in this strategy.

Redenominating the Naira notes could also be an option only after improving the export sector. This could be achieved by removing one zero from each Naira note to restore confidence in the currency. This would mean that a N1000 note would become N100 at its face value. If implemented today, the value of the dollar would become N160. This step could help build confidence in the Naira.

How a dollar will be N160 in Nigeria: A blueprint for economic resurgence

People must have confidence in the Naira, regardless of the amount they possess. Confidence in the Naira is an essential feature of a strong currency. Other countries that faced similar challenges resorted to even reintroducing a new currency and, at some points, demonetizing their currencies, allowing any desirable foreign currency to be used as a means of exchange in their countries. This is the worst-case scenario.

There are no two ways about it. The art of saving a currency is the art of production. No monetary or fiscal policy will work if we don't produce for exports. A stronger Naira is possible only with stronger patriotism. Those hoarding dollars and using sentiment to inflate the value of the dollar are the true enemies of the economy; by hoarding the dollar, they are increasing inflation and thereby reducing the purchasing power of poor people's income and the purchasing power of what they will eventually gain in Naira value. So, they are digging a hole for themselves, too. With patriotism, increased production for exports,

reduced importation, and adequate dollars in the banking system, the dollar could be pegged at below N200.

Tudun Biri is a settlement of mixed Hausa-Fulani and Gbagyi inhabitants with pockets of other ethnic groups like the Ebiras and Nupe. The settlement, which is located some two km away from the Kaduna Airport, experienced an unfortunate mistaken release of bomb by the military, an incident that affected hundreds of people while celebrating the birthday of Prophet Muhammad (SAW) known as Maulud, in December 2023.

The World Bank in a swift reaction to the news and at the behest of the Vice President to the National Working Committee, directed the ANRIN KADUNA PIU to conduct an assessment of the number of casualties affected especially

women, adolescents and children, in order to determine the most critical area of support to the affected families.

ANRIN conducted a house-to-house assessment in Tudun Biri where the basic and immediate area of intervention identified were food, seedlings for farming, pesticides and goats. Other basic amenities identified as lacking in the community include schools, hospitals and

habitable roads. The World Bank, as charged by the Vice President of

the Federal Republic of Nigeria who directed the National Core Working Committee members to undertake urgent action on malnourished children, also directed Kaduna PIU to swing into action to procure all the required relief items and donate to the community as an immediate support.

This impetus set the ANRIN team in motion and on Wednesday culminated in the day the intervention was realised. Items distributed include goats, rice, beans, millet, maize, palm oil, iodized salt, seedlings of tomatoes, cucumbers, Lettuce, and vines of orange flesh sweet potatoes



Dignitaries at the occasion include the representative of the Deputy Governor of Kaduna State, the representative of the Commissioner of Health, the GM Kaduna Agricultural Development Agency, the State Emergency Management Agency (SEMA), and other development partners.

Kaduna State, Army Hospital in joint efforts to curb Lassa Fever

Pollowing the report of a suspected outbreak of Viral Hemorrhagic Fever popularly known as "Lassa Fever" at the 44 Nigerian Army Reference Hospital located in the capital city of Kaduna, Governor Uba Sani directed the Kaduna State Ministry of Health to immediately investigate and ascertain the situation at the health facility.

Consequently, a surveillance team was promptly mobilized to assess the situation and containment measures were initiated in conjunction with the hospital management,

according to a statement by the Chief Press Secretary to the Governor, Mal. Mohammed Lawal Shehu. Lassa Fever, generally infects victims with the following symptoms fever, general body weakness and after a few days, headache, sore throat, muscle pain, chest pain, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, cough, and abdominal pain may follow.

Four deaths were reported following the outbreak all within the hospital premises while three other patients with similar symptoms were sent to be managed.

The statement explained that the Kaduna State Ministry of Health and management of 44 Nigerian Army Reference Hospital, were working assiduously to contain the situation as all those who came in contact with those in fected had been identified and were closely being monitored while receiving urgent medical treatment.

Furthermore, samples have been carefully collected from contacts and sent for confirmation to the Nigeria Centre for Disease Control laboratory and are closely being followed up.

Similarly, all Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures have been instituted at the facility while it remains closed to the public, until full containment has been achieved.

It advised members of the public to maintain proper food and environmental hygiene while they remain hyper vigilant to immediately report any suspected cases of Lassa Fever to the nearest health facility.

Kaduna State Ministry of Health has in the meantime further been directed to enhance surveillance across the state in collaboration with local government health departments.

Uba Sani Fetes in Lagos as Bandits Abduct 230 Kaduna School Children: A Rejoinder

lirst, our thoughts and prayers

are with the families of the kidnapped school children and teachers at Kuriga area of Chikun Local Government Area of Kaduna State who were abducted on Thursday. Like the Governor, Senator Uba Sani, we all fervently pray for the safe, and quick return of every one of them.

While the actual number is yet to be determined, the fact remains that it is a nightmare that no parent or family should go through. And like the United Nations Children's Fund noted in its reaction, the Kaduna State abduction was one too many. Unfortunately, considering the present state of our security agencies, nobody can guarantee that the terrorists wouldn't strike again, and that's the tragedy. Before the Thursday incident of Kaduna State, the terrorists had last week kidnapped over two hundred women and young girls from three (3) IDP camps in Ngala at the Nigeria-Cameroon border.

It's sad to admit this unfortunate truth, that these terrorists would continue to violate with impunity, the fundamental rights of Nigerians until the federal government does the needful. Whether it is the abduction of children from their school, or of adults from their farms and the highways, the implications are devastatingly the same. The only difference being that the intensified campaign of violence by the terrorists against the

innocent school children would further worsen the already terrible number of out of school children in the North. The overall effect, apart from increasing poverty due to farmers abandoning the land and people generally unable to engage in legitimate activities, is the wild spread fear, anxiety and trauma.

Governor Uba Sani, more than anyone else, fully

Governor Sani's bills unfortunately didn't scale through at the harmonization conference due to unfounded fears of misuse by governors, promoted by some members of the National Assembly who are, more often than not, at loggerheads with their governors.

Governor Sani's bills were a bold initiative that would have fundamentally restructured the security architecture and helped in addressing the lingering security challenges facing, not just Kaduna state, but the entire country. And until the National Assembly summons the necessary political will to effect the necessary amendments, the security problem will persist, whether Governor Sani travels to Lagos for an official assignment or is at his Sir. We must reorganise our security architecture for effective performance

Being remarks by Governor Uba Sani as chairman of the 6th Annual Interfaith Dialogue Forum Peace conference on 7th March 2024 in Kaduna

a m e x t r e m e l y delighted to welcome our revered religious leaders to Kaduna.

Your choice of Kaduna for this important and timely conference is the clearest signal that our message of peace and unity is gaining traction. In Kaduna State, we celebrate diversity. Our diversity is our strength. Conflict entrepreneurs have tried to pull us apart, but we have taken the battle to their doorsteps. We are harnessing our diversity and turning it into an asset.

We are reshaping Kaduna State and making it a model of development, ethnic harmony and cooperation. We have committed ourselves to running a pro-people, propoor and all-inclusive administration. Under my watch, equity and justice shall reign supreme in Kaduna State. Kaduna State is a miniature Nigeria. If you understand Kaduna State, chances are that you will understand Nigeria with its challenges, complexities and possibilities.

Your choice of theme for this conference "Tackling Poverty and Insecurity in Nigeria: Our Collective Responsibilities" is apt. Poverty and Insecurity are the biggest challenges facing our country. The increasing poverty level is a major source of worry for political leaders. Addressing the issue of poverty is critical to

restoring the people's faith in our democracy. We are still struggling to address developmental challenges, especially in the areas of infrastructure, education, health, agriculture, and security.

This is the time for all stakeholders to join hands to tackle our security and developmental challenges. We must however approach our problems from a position of knowledge. Our approach must be evidence -based. The starting point towards addressing insecurity in Nigeria is to carry out a comprehensive diagnostic review of the causes of insecurity in Nigeria. Research has a key role to play in our search for workable solutions to the seemingly intractable challenges of insecurity. If you know the causes of the problem, you will be able to fashion effective immediate, short term and long term strategies towards addressing it. Our actions have been ad-hoc and reactive. They do not flow from research. Our compass is faulty. We must get the correct compass.

To make progress in the area of security, we must ask the critical questions and fashion the appropriate strategies. How can we reset our security architecture in such a way that the proactive instead of reactive approach will be adopted in tackling insecurity in Nigeria. This

is where Strategic Thinking comes in. Security Leaders and Forces are more adept at Tactical Thinking. They want to deal with situations quickly and decisively. But the nature of our current and emerging security challenges requires deeper thinking and

planning. You must study the nature of a given environment; the topography, the people, culture, politics and changing dynamics.

You must consult widely to know the best approach to tackling conflicts. You must engage in Scenario Building. This will enable you to systematically spell out the key steps to take, as well as counter measures that would equally be taken in case your actions are made ineffectual. There is therefore the need to balance tactical thinking with strategic thinking. The right balance can make our security agencies to be more effective in the fight against terrorists, insurgents, separatists, kidnappers and other criminal elements.

To overcome insecurity in Nigeria, there is need for effective intelligence gathering and surveillance so that law enforcement agents can be proactive and reasonably predict potential crime with near perfect accuracy rather than being reactive. We must modernise the



security agencies with training, intelligence sharing, advanced technology, logistics, motivation and change of orientation by security personnel.

We must carry out a complete overhaul of our security architecture. Our security institutions must be reformed to align with global best practices. The present set up is ineffective. Except security operations are decentralized, criminal elements will continue to constitute a threat in our communities. This is why we have been agitating for STATE POLICE. Nigeria is a Federation. A State Governor should be in effective control of security in his state. A situation where a Divisional Police Officer will wait for clearance from his superiors before carrying out the instructions of the Governor is unacceptable. There is need for effective coordination and cooperation among and across security agencies.

Uba Sani's zero tolerance for corruption

The Governor of Kaduna state, Senator Uba Sani's resolute decision to fight corruption and institute accountability in the state, has not come as a surprise to keen observers of his political career. Right from his civil society days, through the senate and to his election as governor, Governor Sani has, in words and deeds, demonstrated deep aversion to corruption in all its ramifications.

It is very easy to understand why an activist like Governor Sani should display a zero tolerance for corrupt practices. Not only does graft have corrosive effects, it destroys the very foundation of society by weakening the impact of public service delivery. Though corruption affects all citizens negatively, the poor are certainly the worst victims. Governor Sani's determination to wage a sustained war against the deadly cancer speaks volumes of his courage and commitment to good governance.

Many observers see Uba Sani's perpetual campaign against dishonesty practices in public space as a natural course of an activist, because corruption undermines good governance, human rights and the rule of law.

Notorious bank debtors, who made indebtedness to commercial banks a hobby, would not forget Governor Sani in a hurry. The consequential amendment of the Asset Management Corporation of Nigeria (AMCON) Act, which he spearheaded as the Chairman of the Senate Committee on Banking, Finance, Insurance and Financial Institutions ensured that chronic bank

debtors do not get away with their financial heist. Sani's savage reaction to their refusal to repay their loans was the inclusion of a Loan Tribunal in the amended AMCON Act, to assist the agency in the recovery of loans from debtors who, hitherto used legal gymnastics to stall repayment of their facilities. It's to the credit of Governor Sani's leadership that the law has improved loan repayment to the banks.

In Governor Sani's words, the refusal by the debtors to repay their loans amounted to "orchestrated acts of

corruption and economic sabotage". This was because their actions gravely hampered the ability of banks to lend money to honest investors, precipitated instability in the financial market which affected economic growth, and

eroded the confidence of bank customers.

In the last few weeks, Governor Sani has taken very decisive actions in line with his continued determination to fight the scourge of corruption in Kaduna state. The swift actions he took over some infractions by the Kaduna State University (KASU) and the Kaduna State Traffic Law Enforcement Authority (KASTLEA) demonstrated his zero tolerance for corruption.

It would be recalled that the management of the KASU committed the heinous crime of flagrantly flouting Governor Sani's clear and unambiguous directives on the reduction of fees and levies for students in Stateowned tertiary institutions. On assumption of office, the governor, following passionate appeals by parents, had reduced the fees and scrapped the levies to help cushion the harsh economic situation on the poor, who are dear to his heart, and are at the center of his politics.

In the case of KASTLEA, one of its operatives was caught on video diverting revenue due the Kaduna state government, using Point of Sale (POS)



machine, after subjecting the citizen to dehumanising torture that compelled him to eventually pay up. Sad to say, the action of the operative was not an isolated incident, as many operatives of the agency are notorious for extortion, h a r a s s m e n t a n d intimidation of motorists.

The university and KASTLEA managements have themselves to blame for their poor judgment and for feigning ignorance of Governor Sani's pro-poor stance. Among his very first actions in office were the reduction of fees and abolition of levies, and the signing of the executive

order on the Financial Inclusion of 2.1 million poor, and vulnerable citizens previously excluded from the financial services, which had denied them access to state and federal government's social intervention programmes.

It is also baffling how the management of KASTLEA refused to take note of the Governor's premium on revenue generation, and communicate same to their staff to "change their ways". Governor Sani has never ceased to stress the need for revenue agencies to generate the necessary revenue to fund his rural transformation agenda.

The visible anger of Governor Sani, who as the visitor to Kaduna State University has supervisory powers over the institution, is understandable. The inexplicable actions of the KASU and the KASTLEA managements could have dented his pro- poor credentials, which he guards jealously. The KASU management was certainly uncharitable to the Governor and to the parents to have re-imposed a burden that the governor, at great cost to the state, lifted off the shoulders of the citizens.

The state government virtually funds the university because whatever internally generated revenue (IGR) KASU generates are largely unaccounted for. So, you ask, what was the university authorities' justification for re-imposing the fees and the levies abolished by the benevolent governor? Could it be that the management of these agencies delude themselves that they are above the law?

Lack of synergy for a long time weakened our efforts and strengthened criminal elements in Nigeria. For example, when a military operation is being carried out in one state, blocking forces are hardly stationed in neighbouring states. When the heat is too much, the criminal elements take refuge in neighbouring states and end up taking out their frustrations on innocent civilians.

There is also need for the six geopolitical zones to develop Common Strategies and Operational Plans to tackle insecurity. The zones must establish Command and Control Centres to coordinate joint efforts against terrorists, bandits, kidnappers and other criminal elements in their regions.

We must fight corruption initiate comprehensive campaign for ethical reorientation in Nigeria. Corruption has undermined development in Nigeria, leading to frustration and anger among

the people. Corruption is a violation of the people's right to development. We must fight this cankerworm or we lose the support and confidence of our people. There is also unfortunately a shift in the value system in Nigeria. Many of our people now celebrate ill-gotten wealth. This has led to a culture of desperation and winning at all costs. We must work collectively to reorientate our people and channel their energies towards decent work and development.

10. We must develop a framework for psychological operations a n d strategic communication to win the hearts and minds of citizens in Nigeria. An effective non -kinetic approach must be developed and fully implemented to win the support of our citizens and get them fully involved in the fight against terrorism, insurgency, banditry, kidnapping and other forms of criminality in Nigeria.

We must, in our respective states, not only hold regular meetings with elders, religious leaders, representatives of youth and women groups, but establish STATE $C\ O\ N\ S\ U\ L\ T\ A\ T\ I\ V\ E$ COMMITTEES ON INSECURITY. They will play a key role in gathering intelligence, mobilizing the citizens on security and development issues, as well as nipping potential crisis in the bud.

To address the challenges of poverty and insecurity, we must forge partnerships among and across states in the areas of infrastructure development, agriculture and poverty alleviation. are "citizens who have been displaced from their homes due to various challenges."

While noting that Southern part of Kaduna has seen its fair share of displacement due to the incidents of violence plaguing the state, she stressed that the plight of these displaced persons "weighs heavily on our collective conscience, and it is

crucial that we take decisive action to address their needs and facilitate their resettlement."

The committee has the Secretary to the State Government, Commissioner of Internal Security and Home Affairs, and the chairmen of Jema'a, Kaura, and Zangon Kataf Local Government Areas, as members, among others.

Dr Balarabe also said the primary objective of the committee was to devise comprehensive strategies for the effective resettlement of displaced persons in the Southern continue on page 23

"It is crucial that we approach this task with empathy, sensitivity, fairness, sense of urgency a n d a commitment to inclusivity. We must actively engage with the


